



Protecting Your Benefits

As your Trustee, our aim is to have enough money in the Scheme to pay members' pensions and other benefits when they are due. As you can see from this Summary Funding Statement, the Scheme is in a very strong financial position with a significant surplus.

One of the ways schemes commonly look to secure members' benefits is to purchase an insurance policy, which is known as a 'buy-out' after which the Scheme would wind up. As at 31 December 2022 (the last three-yearly valuation), the Scheme had enough money to purchase this insurance policy, being able to meet almost 113% of the full cost which provides further evidence of the strong financial position of the Scheme.

There is no intention to close or wind up the Scheme, we simply have to include this information as part of our statement.

The Pension Protection Fund

For cases where a company goes out of business and doesn't have the money to pay the benefits promised, the Government has set up the Pension Protection Fund (PPF), which can pay compensation to members. You can find out more about the PPF on its website: www.ppf.co.uk

Other things we need to tell you

There have not been any payments made to any employer out of the Scheme funds in the last 12 months.

The Scheme's investment strategy is set by us, the Trustee, after taking appropriate independent advice.

The Scheme's assets are split across a wide variety of different fund managers and investment types, including company shares, property, government bonds and corporate bonds. Along with our investment adviser, we consider environmental, social, and governance criteria when setting the investment strategy and will continue to do so.

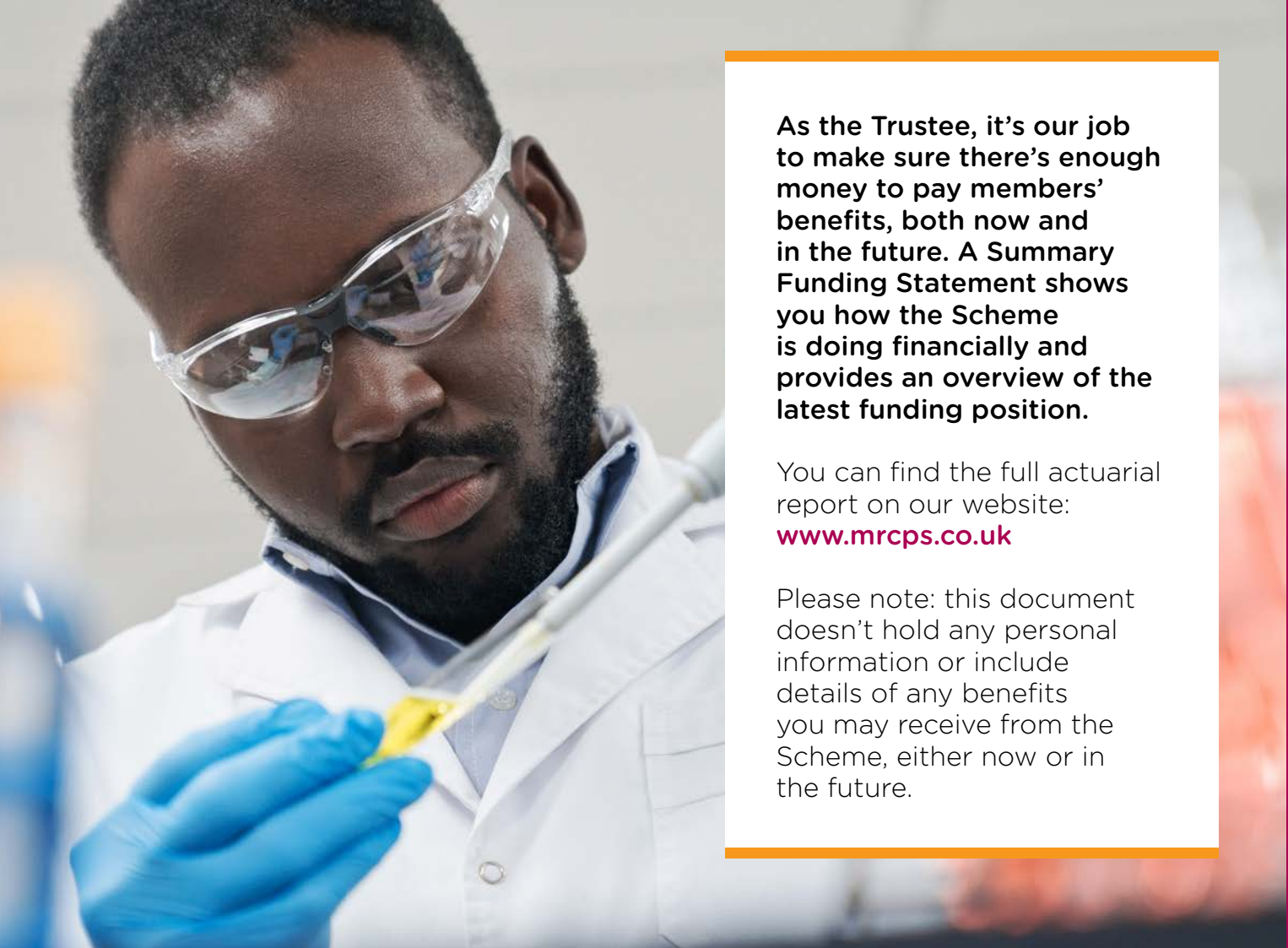

Welcome to your 2024 Summary Funding Statement

Every three years, we are required to carry out a full actuarial valuation which is an in-depth analysis of the Scheme’s funding position and the factors that influence this. These are also reviewed annually in between so we can keep an eye on any movement. By carrying out these checks, it allows us to understand how the Scheme is doing to make sure we can pay the benefits that are due to members both now and in the future.

This year’s Summary Funding Statement shows the financial position of the Scheme as at 31 December 2024 following its annual review, and how it compares with last year’s annual review and the latest valuation as at 31 December 2022.

In summary, we are pleased to report that the Scheme remains in a very strong financial position.

You do not need to do anything as a result of receiving this update. The details provided in this update are for your information only and to help you keep track of the financial health of the Scheme from year to year.

The Scheme’s Financial Position

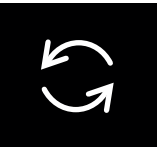
The Trustee is pleased to report the Scheme is in a very strong financial position, with the funding level for both sections of the Scheme seeing an increase over the year to 31 December 2024. Over the next two pages, you can see in more detail how the Scheme has performed in 2024, compared with the 2023 annual review and 2022 valuation.

As a reminder, the Scheme provides benefits on a ‘Defined Benefit’ basis. This means pensions and other benefits are calculated based on members’ pensionable service and salary and are not determined by the contributions paid in and the investment return received. The funding level is an estimate of the Scheme’s total liabilities (the benefits due to be paid) compared to the assets (the investments held in the Scheme).

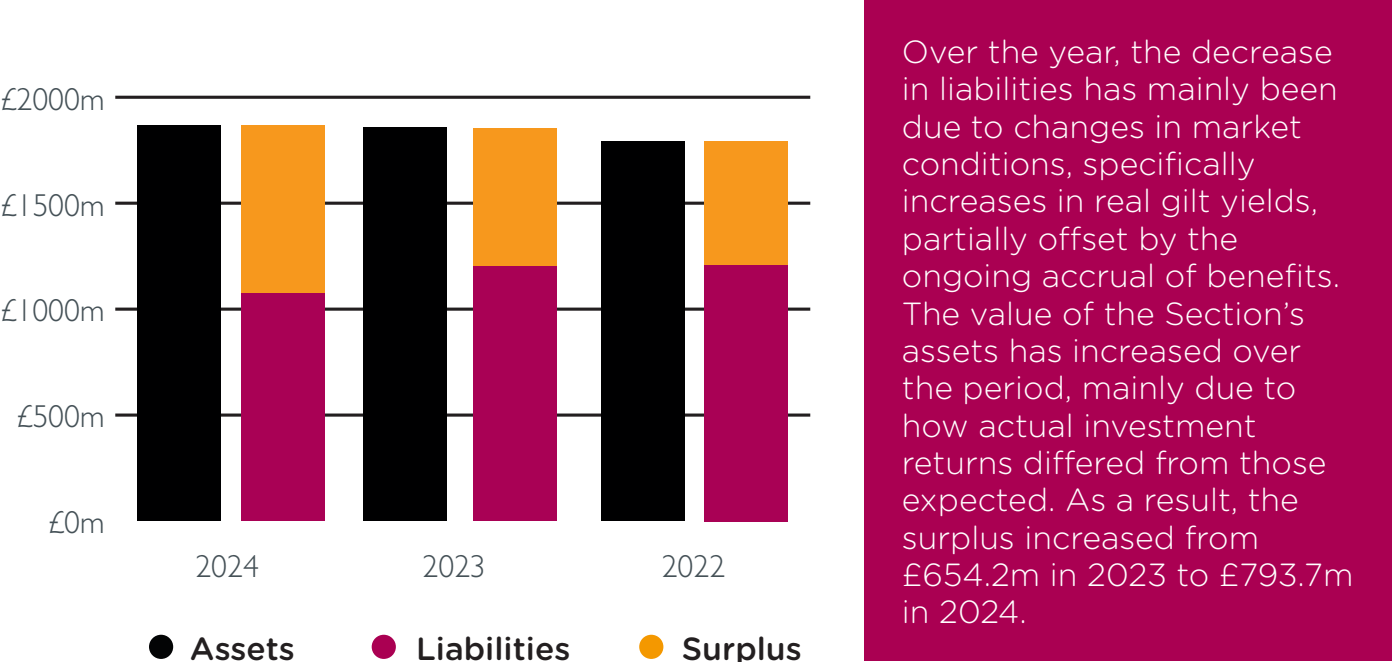
The 2024 Annual Review

The Scheme consists of two sections - the MRC Section and the Universities Section. The latest funding review as of 31 December 2024 has been completed and is shown alongside the 31 December 2023 annual review and the 31 December 2022 formal valuation results.

The MRC Section has a funding level of 174% which has increased since the 2023 review and is in a very strong financial position with enough money to pay members’ benefits when they are due.

The Universities Section has a funding level of 152% which has increased since the 2023 review and is also in a very strong financial position with enough money to pay members’ benefits when they are due.
